#### **Executive Summary**

The Centre for Internal Quality Assurance (CIQA) at Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University, in collaboration with the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA) and the Indira Miri School of Education, conducted a three-day capacity building program from October 4th to 6th, 2023, with the goal of empowering faculty and academic counselors of KKHSOU in Open Educational Resource (OER) creation, emphasizing the 5R's (retain, reuse, revise, remix, redistribute). The program, attended by 40 participants from KKHSOU and other higher educational institutions, began with an inaugural session featuring esteemed guests. It included informative sessions on OER basics, licensing, attributing original authors, and tools for OER creation. The final day allowed participants to present their assigned tasks and encouraged them to create their own OERs. The valedictory session featured the distribution of certificates and expressions of gratitude from participants and resource persons. Overall, the program successfully equipped participants with the knowledge and skills needed to harness OERs for educational purposes.

- To understand OER Fundamentals, copyright and licensing.
- To demonstrate effective methods for finding quality OER materials.
- To offer technical training on tools and platforms for creating, sharing and collaborating on OERs
- To demonstrate ways to integrate OERs effectively into course curricula and educational programs.
- To explore methods for assessing the impact and effectiveness of OER usage on student learning outcomes.

9. Workshop Session description in brief:

Day 1: 04-10-2024

**Registration (9.00-9.30 am)** 

The first day began with registration from 9.00 a.m to 9.30 a.m, where all 40 participants signed

up for the capacity building program.

Inaugural Session: (9.30-10.30am)

The inauguration session, from 9.30 a.m. to 10.30 a.m., featured esteemed guests Dr. Pranab

Saikia, Director (i/c) of CIQA, KKHSOU delivered the welcome address. Dr. Basheerhamad

Shadrach, Director of Commonwealth Education Media Centre for Asia, provided an online

inaugural address, emphasizing the significance of OERs. The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of

KKHSOU Professor Rajendra Prasad Das, shared his insights in the presidential remarks wherein

he highlighted the importance of the workshop for developing OER materials by the University

faculty. Dr. Pema Eden Samdup, Senior Advisor at CEMCA, and Prof. Jeetendra Pande, the

resource person of the programme from Uttarakhand Open University were introduced and

felicitated during the inaugural session. The formal vote of thanks was given by Dr. Indrani Kalita

Assistant Coordinator of the three-day capacity building programme for the inaugural session.

Session I: (11.00 am -1.00pm)

Following the inaugural session, Dr. Pema Eden Samdup conducted the first session on OER

giving a basic overview of the same and projected the importance of OER in the present

educational scenario. It was followed by Professor Jeetendra Pande's presentation on OERs, their

uses, types and licenses with a special focus on OER and research.

Session II: (2.00pm -5.00 pm)

Professor Pande continued with the second session with a recap of the day's first session, delving

into the topic of 'Licensing OERs.' Open and CC licenses were discussed, with a focus on

Attribution (BY), Share Alike (SA), Non-Derivative (ND), and Non-Commercial (NC) conditions.

The six types of licenses and concepts like Copyright, Fair Use, and Public Domain were explored. Professor Pande also clarified distinctions between Public Domain, Open License, and All Rights Reserved Copyright. The differences between Citation and Attribution were highlighted, and an overview of other licenses like General Public License, MIT License, and Open Government License was provided. The session concluded with a quiz and hands-on activity on finding OER materials.

Day 2 (5-10-2023)

Session I: (9.30am -1.00 pm)

Prof. Jeetendra Pande began the morning session of second day with a discussion on searching for OERs through directories, platforms, and repositories. A quiz and activity were conducted. The session covered discussion and hands on activity on Compatibility of OER licenses. The session also covered merging, sharing, and creating licenses for OERs, concluding with a brief Q&A.

**Session II:** (2 .00pm-5.00pm)

The second session highlighted attributing the original author, discussing the provision of appropriate licensing for attribution creation. Several tools such as the Open Washington tool for attribution creation were introduced and exercises on giving attribution were demonstrated. Also, the use of Creative Commons in YouTube for accessing OERs and various OER image repositories were demonstrated. The session concluded with a discussion on adoption, adaption, and creation of OERs and the steps for adopting an open textbook.

Day 3 (6-10-2023)

**Session I: (9.30am-1.00pm)** 

The final day's morning session, led by Professor Pande, offered a comprehensive overview of OER licensing processes. Participants revisited the six Creative Commons licenses, gaining a deeper understanding of their implications. Participants were assigned tasks in this session as in several other sessions conducted earlier. The participant presented their task as assigned to them in the session.

#### Session II: (2.00 pm-3.00 pm)

The last session of the three-day capacity building programme on OER creation led by Prof. Pande was recap of all the sessions for the three days and participants were encouraged to create own OER.

## Valedictory Session (3.00 -4.00 pm)

The valedictory session was graced by the Honourable Vice Chancellor of KKHSOU, Prof. Rajendra Prasad Das, Prof. N. N. Sarma, Finance Officer(ic) & Director of Maniram Dewan School of Management, the two resource persons, Dr. Pema Eden Samdup, Senior Advisor at CEMCA, and Prof. Jeetendra Pande, Uttarakhand Open University and Director, CIQA, Dr. Pranab Saikia. Dr. Indrani Kalita, Assistant Professor, Indira Miri School of Education and assistant coordinator of the programme briefed the summary of the three day capacity building programme. It was followed by a brief speech by Prof. Nripendra Narayan Sarma on the essence of OER at present day context. Both resource persons expressed their experience and appreciated the active participation of the all the participants and thanked the authority. A few participants also shared their gratitude and thankfulness to the resource persons, authority as well as to the organizing team. This was followed by the presidential remark by the Honourable Vice Chancellor of KKHSOU. The dignitaries distributed the certificates of participation to the participants. The final and formal vote of thanks was given by Dr. Pranab Saikia, Director CIQA. The programme ended with a group photograph and it successfully equipped participants with the knowledge and skills needed to create and utilize OERs in the field of education.
