

Observation of World Radio Day 2024

The world Radio Day is celebrated on 13th February each year internationally. As a part of this International Day, the University took the initiative to organize a free health check-up at one of its adopted villages “Ganapati” on February 11th 2024. The camp was jointly organized by the Electronic Media Production Centre (EMPC) and Mother Teresa Social Welfare Mission of the University in association with Sanjibani Sangha, the Lady Doctors’ Association, Gauhati Medical College (GMCH) Guwahati.



The health check-up camp saw over a 112 individuals, including children and women in various ages, undergo health check-up. A team of 18 women specialists from different departments like Pediatric, Gynecology, Nephrology, Medicine etc. from Gauhati



Medical College were present in the camp. They diagnosed the attendees and provided free medication according to their ailments and also prescribed further treatment if necessary. Free medicines such as multi- vitamins, liver tonic, sanitary pads, general flue and illness, children kits were also provided to all the attendees.
