Inaugural Ceremony of the Year-long Birth Centenary Celebration of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika

The Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) inaugurated the Year-long Birth Centenary Celebration of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika, the internationally acclaimed artist, cultural icon, and Bharat Ratna awardee, with a solemn and vibrant ceremony held at the University's City Campus Auditorium, Khanapara, Guwahati, on 8th September 2025.
